We're pleased once again to invite you to our Annual Meeting. Although our Newsletter keeps you informed of our progress during the year, it's our gathering together each spring, this touching base with one another, that more quickly affirms our mutual interest in Christian Science Nursing.

There's been much growth at Fern Lodge since our last meeting, sparked undoubtedly by Naomi Price's pointed remarks. You'll see the resultant changes and the new volunteers at work during an audio-visual slide show following Duane Gunnison's talk.

Constant upgrading continues, thanks to the metaphysical support and benevolence of our much appreciated donors. We still need your support. We constantly grow in our concept of care, in recognizing what improvements better reflect our goal of providing an atmosphere that allows patients, nurses, and practitioners to prove their growing awareness of immortality. We are always looking for nurses who want to join our progressive staff. An innovation for Fern Lodge is service on a constantly available basis for acute and emergency cases.

Thanks to your continued donations, another five Hill-Rom electric beds have been ordered for Hillside House, the more intensive care wing. That leaves just four to go, approximately \$6,400 worth.

We are becoming more aware of the need for space (and here is where you might help us metaphysically for guidance) for storing nursing equipment and for a living room area in Hillside House, as suggested by The Mother Church inspection team, and for additional office space. YOU MAY NEED TO KNOW:

1) That no portion of your contribution has been or will be used for fund raising expenses. Your entire gift is utilized for the improvement and operation of Fern Lodge.

2) That Fern Lodge is tax-exempt under both Federal and State law.

3) That your contribution is taxdeductible under Federal and State law.

We are heartened by the number of Branch Churches and Christian Science Teachers' Associations whose memberships have voted to contribute regularly or occasionally to Fern Lodge. One of your members may be a patient at Fern Lodge and would be encouraged by the support your Branch Church or Association can give.






VOLUNTEERS ANSWER MRS. PRICE'S CALL

OUR ardent, enthusiastic Annual Meeting speaker, NAOMI PRICE, last May put on the line the necessity for each church member to contribute to, and metaphysically support, its local care facility. Her emphasis on the close-at-hand opportunity it affords for giving active support to the church's healing mission through practical, active volunteer service, stimulated a surge of most welcome added volunteer workers at Fern Lodge. Even one part-time nurse has been inspired to come on her off-duty days.

Pictured here are some of the varied talents and interests that filled a need: taking patients for automobile rides or a wheelchair trip around the grounds, ironing, reading to the group and dining with them afterward for informal visiting, bringing Bluebirds to entertain and visit with the patients, shopping, one-to-one reading or reading occasionally for Sunday or Wednesday services, showing movies or slides, teaching or speaking about a hobby or showing a collection.







QUARTERLY METAPHYSICAL SPEAKER: Nancy Gunnison, CS

"WHAT'S new? Everything's new!" said NANCY GUNNISON when she spoke to a record attendance at Fern Lodge's Staff Quarterly Metaphysical meeting. Then she quoted this hymn, "O Life that maketh all things new, The blooming earth, the thoughts of men;...The sense of Life that knows no death, The Life that maketh all things new."

Mrs. Gunnison pointed out that Jesus always used the present tense: "This is life eternal," "He that believeth on the son has eternal life." "Eternal," she said, "is not to do with time, but with a quality of life - glorious, fresh, new, vigorous, joyous - now, not sometime in the future...Eternal Life is existing when we have this relationship with God.

"When Jesus said, 'He that heareth my word and believeth on him that sent me shall not come into condemnation, but is passed from death into life' he was saying that he has already left death behind and entered into Life. Therefore, death, or dead living, is <u>not</u> to know God. Life is knowing God.

"Everything about you is always new. How practical it is to allow that quality of newness to become tangible to you...

"Why should anyone who is a giver for us of God's infinite resources ever feel unneeded? The sun never feels unneeded, beautiful flowers never feel unneeded, they shine and bloom because it's their nature. They don't know how not to shine or bloom. That's how divine Soul has designed us to be - we don't know how not to pour forth the glory of God.

"Have you ever thought of how every ending is just a new beginning? The crucifixion wasn't an ending, it was the beginning of the resurrection. The resurrection wasn't an ending, it was the beginning of the ascension. There's never a moment when we're all finished, all through. We may think we've finished raising children, finished a career, but that's not an ending, it's just the beginning of a new view of divine goodness and love. We should expect to see these new views all along. Not the same views, the same loved ones, the same job, etc., but new views...

"Be aware of all the beauty around us, practice this awareness, develop the capacity to



have wonder about everything. To one who is filled with eagerness and interest, delight and wonder, the world is wonder-full! This is recognizing the evidence of divine Love."

Explaining how to find newness and freshness in the old, loved, most often quoted passages from the Bible, Mrs. Gunnison used these two as examples:

"' I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with loving-kindness have I drawn thee.' (Jer. 31:3) Substitute other God-like qualities, such as, 'I have satisfied thee with an everlasting satisfaction, therefore with satisfaction have I drawn thee.' Or use, I have taught thee, equipped thee, prospered thee, beautified thee, regulated thee, redeemed thee, enlightened thee with an everlasting light, therefore with light have I created thee.

"Or, as Paul said, 'I can do all things through Christ which strengthenest me.' (Phil. 4:13) Try substituting, 'I am inspired through Christ which inspires me', I am quickened or comforted, powerful, substantial, refreshed, stable, wise, soft, content, pure, secure, I am <u>new</u> through Christ which renews me.

"So, when you're asked, 'What's new?"" Mrs. Gunnison suggested, "How about answering, 'I am!!"
