

All rightly framed together with integrity, obedience, patience, stedfastness?




Dear Friends,

Are we looking upward and seeing life's freshness and God's constant renewal with each new day? We have a choice to make whenever we think about Christian Science nursing. What do we think about Fern Lodge? Do we allow mortal mind to push our thinking into the hopelessness of -- "that is where old people go to live and eventually die?" Or do we acknowledge the presence and power of the Christ to overcome disease, disability and death, while we prayerfully declare that age and incapacity are nothing but illusions?

We should diligently strive to "put off the old man with his deeds; and put on the new man." Then we can rejoice in progress and the newness of life that is taking place everywhere, certainly at Fern Lodge, daily.

Our just-finished building project, pictured on these and the previous pages, has answered our need for a Hillside living room, a practitioners room, a classroom, increased storage and a Century bath tub. We have added space for two additional patients, making our current capacity 32, and we are already filled to this new capacity.

We are so grateful to tell you that this total project was paid for by your generous donations. Thank you all so much!





Now our decorating committee of Board and Staff members is working to coordinate furnishings. As funds become available we will purchase furniture for our new rooms, and we plan to renew the well-worn furniture, drapes and floors in all of our guest rooms in both houses.

Next we look forward to the day we can increase our capacity to meet the growing demands for nursing care in our community. We are receiving the money from the sale of Laurel Haven and are investing it until it can be used. When the Laurel Haven Board of Directors voted to sell they gave the preceeds to Fern Lodge with the condition that the funds be used **only** to construct a larger facility to care for 12 to 15 additional patients. As of this writing we are working on preliminary plans, but we do not yet have the property on which to build. When we are able to start construction we think that we will have funds to cover about one-half of the total cost.

Fern Lodge is reaffirming the commitment to provide care for Christian Scientists who are in financial need, since our waiting list indicates that about 75% of those who need care are unable to afford it. Thanks to the support of private patients and generous donations from the field, we have been able to give benevolence to over 60% of our patients.

We will continue to keep you informed of our progress and plans so you will be aware of the results of your support. Most importantly we are seeing the healing results of God's presence and power, and we will share fruitage with you regularly.

May 1st seems to be a very special day in nursing for Robin Looney. On May 1st she will have completed her seventh year at Fern Lodge as a practical nurse, "I've grown with Fern Lodge as it's grown!" May 1st in 1975 Robin began in Christian Science nursing in a nurses aide program at Upward View. Phoenix, Arizona. Again, May 1st 1976, Robin began On-Job-Training at Laurel Haven Sanatorium in San Mateo, California. She began her practical nursing career at Fern Lodge on May 1st, 1977 and has served faithfully since then, helping Fern Lodge through some difficult periods. We have been especially grateful to Robin for her willingness to serve as Night Duty Supervisor for the last three years.

In May Robin will leave Fern Lodge to begin second year nurses classroom training at Arden Wood. She plans to continue second year training there, and return to Fern Lodge for third year OJT as a trainee.

The idea to continue training had been prayerfully considered for some time, "I looked into several other possible careers and was never really happy. Finally, one evening while on night duty I realized that if this is what God wants for me then just being happy doesn't matter. It dawned on me that I wanted to be obedient. This changed my thought, everything fell into place, resulting in a wonderful new feeling of joy and happiness about nursing."

"A Christian Science nurse's love of God and prayerful study should be balanced with other interests..." says Mindee Spear, the second graduate nurse to receive third year On-Job-Training at Fern Lodge(the first was Patricia Alvarez, our current On-Job-Instructor). Mindee, who rides western horseback and studies voice, values a complete sense of life for the Christian Science nurse.

Steps toward nursing as a career came as a result of "an increased ability to listen to God and an awakening to what God is all about." Christian Science class instruction was a major factor in this awakening, "you become more aware of the Christ and how it illumines whatever you are doing. It's like a laser beam of light illumining thought."

Mrs. Spear attended a visiting nurse annual meeting, and there a nurse told her, "you already are a nurse" and that we all are Christian Science nurses sharing and expressing the Christ-like qualities.

Starting in September of 1980, Mrs. Spear served at Arden Wood in San Francisco with the Housekeeping Department while waiting for a nurse aide course. At Arden Wood she went on to first and second year classes and On-Job-Training. Her third year OJT site was Fern Lodge. Congratulations and best wishes Graduate Nurse, Mindee Spear!

- * "Completion of this building project does not mean that Fern Lodge is finished. The development of Fern Lodge is continuous and the new construction is symbolic of an unfolding ability to nurse ... and to express the love and care God gives His children everywhere."
- A staff member told of his study of the story of Nehemiah building the wall of Jerusalem. When the wall was complete, the work didn't just stop. People were brought in to live in Jerusalem and the houses of the city were rebuilt. We should continue in the same way to keep improving within our walls and to make room for those who need Fern Lodge.
- * Another employee shared gratitude for the evidence of individual growth in staff members which has accompanied the growth of Fern Lodge.
