
Our New Year Adventure

On New Year's Eve, it was quickly becoming apparent that the storm was growing stronger than we had come to expect in sunny California. As Fern Lodge's safeguards against the runoff and the rising creek looked to fail, George called the fire department and they agreed it was time to evacuate. The fire department helped transport the patients to the facility's emergency rendezvous, the nearby Hayward Christian Science church, while the staff gathered mattresses, bedding, and supplies. Pretty soon the Sunday school, childcare, and board room were transformed into a temporary home for patients.

While the day had been different and exciting, as night fell the Christian Science nurses still continued as normal, albeit in a very different setting. Fern Lodge staff and church members turned out to help. Sharon ensured everything was still running smoothly and everyone had a place to sleep. Anna picked up and delivered food for everyone. Many others contributed to ensuring orderly harmony.

As the dawn broke on a new year, the storm temporarily subsiding, Fern Lodge looked to how we could be prepared to get the patients home permanently and as quickly as patients were able to attend, relevantly focused on Elijah small voice for how to proceed.





Infinite Love









While it's been a long time, this is not the first time Fern Lodge has felt the effects of a large storm. In every time of need, we have been surrounded by the warmth of everpresent love and support, and even now we feel the effects of that love from days past. That which was built after past storms helped mitigate the effects of this storm years later and we hope that in the future, if such an event strikes again, people will look warmly back at the work we are doing now.

With the second rainiest day on record in San Francisco—over 5 inches of rain in a matter of hours—the damage could have been far worse. As it was, the creek had risen to the point that the runoff from neighboring hills couldn't drain properly and instead seeped into the facility. The patients' rooms had waterresistant tile and water hadn't risen to the point of damaging equipment, furniture, or records, but much of the flooring in other rooms was beyond repair and the grounds were covered in silt and mud from the creek. There was a lot of work to do before the facility was habitable again and another projected storm on the horizon.

Fern Lodge dug in, several staff members cutting vacations short and coming in on their days off, but we looked up and found that we were not alone! Before they could be asked, the community poured in with supplies and support. The family of Rosa, our head of housekeeping, came out to move furniture and clean floors. After the service, church member changed and drove out to help in any way they could. Neighbors checked in on us, one bringing out his tractor to break through the layers of mud in the parking lot. Jack Craig from Broadview, a facility in southern California, came up and spent an entire week helping us clean and repair. We are so grateful for everyone who provided care, time, and support and for the opportunity to see a display of community and warmth inherent in the everpresence of Love.

As soon as Monday the patients were able to return back to their rooms. What could have been many days of displacement became merely a rather eventful weekend. Patients described the event as a wonderful time to witness love and harmony being expressed. And as winter storms continued to roll through with all their excitement, we have not been required to evacuate again.

Even with the patients back in their rooms, mud removed, and sandbags in place, there was a lot to be done, both to repair the damage and to prevent more. Ben, his maintenance team, and our trusted construction contacts got to work. Carpeting had to be ripped up and replaced with either new carpet or vinyl plank flooring. The drainage channel on the edge of the property had to be rebuilt, stronger and deeper. Foundations were fortified, bridges reinforced, and retaining walls constructed. While there are many projects, each day we get see the growth and steadfastness of Fern Lodge as they are completed one step at a time.















While this emergency added a lot of work and cost that we weren't expecting, it also provided an opportunity! Several rooms, including the reception area, all five living rooms, the office, and the Christian Science nurses' breakroom, are now revamped and ready for staff and patients to use. We are so excited to have these spaces brightened up to allow for a better working and living situation.

Valentine House, our housing up the street for Christian Science nurses, also faced some effects of the storm and the rising creek. The foundations of both bridges from the street to the property were damaged and water had soaked into two garages. In order to avoid further harm, both in the face of a stormy winter and with frequent use of the bridges, action was taken. The bridges were reinforced and we installed a sump tank and a French drain to create a path for future rains.

The biggest project Fern Lodge undertook in light of this storm was strengthening the creek banks. Two creeks join and run along Madison Avenue. They were overgrown with ivy, trees, and brush and not prepared for the kinds of rains we experienced. As such, Fern Lodge paid to have the creek cleared out and lowered, not only in front of Fern Lodge but stretching up past many neighboring properties and all the way down to the cross street, Seaview Avenue. This cost us around 15,000 dollars; it was a large expense, but an important one long-term. The neighborhood has been very appreciative and we cherish their kind words.

From George's Desk,

We've had an unusual winter at Fern Lodge. For only the second time in our history, the creek in front of the facility overflowed its banks. This, combined with the runoff from the neighboring hills, flooded the parking

lot with muddy water, which came into the buildings, and spread everywhere. We had to evacuate the buildings and take patients to the Hayward Christian Science church for two nights. We are so deeply grateful to the local Fire Department and Sheriff's Department for their prompt and capable assistance in transporting both the patients and their mattresses from Fern Lodge to the church and helping us get settled.


Moving back to Fern Lodge two days later was much easier. We were able to return and resume as normal, thanks to the dedicated and capable assistance of our staff, with their families and friends.

We had to remove and replace the flooring in several rooms. We are still paying for some of the needed work, and the cost of the evacuation, the extra work, and the needed facility repairs will come to nearly \$100,000.

True Education

After teaching and helping students of Principia flourish for many years, as well as working in support of multiple Christian Science nursing facilities and for The Mother Church, Dr. Brad Stock offered a new opportunity to Christian Science nurses, facility staff, and trustees. In 2022, he began teaching a series of courses on the history of Christian Science nursing, with the goal to "strengthen our individual inspiration and our collective commitment to Christian Science nursing by seeing more clearly how our understanding of Christian Science nursing has evolved over the generations, both in terms of individual ministries and organizational contexts." Several Christian Science nurses and members of Fern Lodge staff took advantage of the course over the months of September to February as a test run. The virtual classroom contained an impressive roster, from longtime Christian Science nurses to authors of some of the Christian Science Journal and Sentinel articles that were required reading for the course. They all came together to learn and discuss and they found the class to be full of spiritual growth and insight.

Brad Stock knew of the growth in practical application and metaphysical understanding that comes from studying the history of the movement in relation to Christian nursing, because he had already witnessed it. Originally, the course was developed for a Principia student who had a keen interest in pursuing Christian Science nursing, and then was reprised for several students over the years. He scoured through the Christian Science Journal, Sentinel, and Monitor for articles on Christian Science nursing to better understand the evolution of the movement's metaphysical idea of what Christian Science nursing is and how it should be applied. Later the idea came to him that this course could grant a deeper understanding within Christian Science nursing facilities, which would support their efforts and care. He explains, "The heart and soul of Christian Science nursing is in spiritual witnessing and in reflecting the radiance of divine Love. All of us can gain a deeper, more practical awareness of this Christian ministry"
