"There's just something about Fern Lodge." I heard this again and again last year when I came to Fern Lodge for my first visit — from almost everyone I met. And I have to admit that it intrigued me. What did they mean?

In all honesty, I had never heard of Fern Lodge before that visit. I hadn't ever lived in the San Francisco Bay Area and I hadn't worked in the field of Christian Science nursing. So there was really no reason for me to be aware of a facility that more than one person has called "a hidden gem."

It was clear that these fans of Fern Lodge weren't just talking about its setting, although the unassuming beauty of its surroundings is noteworthy: the tranquility of a California bungalow nestled beside a creek and surrounded by flowering plants and fruit trees. What makes Fern Lodge truly special

has nothing to do with its location or architecture. It has much more to do with the quality of thought of those who work here.

After a few months of observing the Christian Science nursing staff at Fern Lodge, one word popped



into my head: grace. This quality — which Mary Baker Eddy says should be expressed in "patience, meekness, love, and good deeds" (*Science and Health*, p. 4) — seems to be at the heart of everything that our Christian Science nurses do.

It's inspiring to see the patience, meekness, and love they express on a daily basis to the patients who come to Fern Lodge for healing. And it's inspiring to know that the Christian Science nursing students in our education program are being trained by mentors who teach and model such grace so consistently.

But what has struck me even more about Fern Lodge is that the expression of grace is not limited to our Christian Science nursing staff. It is demonstrated by individuals throughout the organization. By the support staff managers who have worked here for decades. By the cooks in our kitchen and the dedicated workers in our Activities Department, the housekeepers and maintenance staff and Business Office personnel.

All these members of our community offer grace on a daily basis, not only to our patients and their families, but also to each other. They seem to naturally look for opportunities to extend gentle, loving support to anyone who steps foot on the premises — from patients, to co-workers, to the repairman who comes to fix the oven.

In that way, nursing at Fern Lodge isn't limited to the Christian Science nurses who provide care for our patients. It is the essence of everything we do here, of who we are and how we go

about our day. It is our unified team of staff members, endeavoring to fulfil our mission of providing care to anyone who needs it with hearts deeply rooted in grace. And it is this atmosphere of thought that promotes healing for everyone it touches — for patients, for staff members, and for anyone who visits the property. This is the "something" about Fern Lodge that makes it so special.

I am very grateful to be a part of this inspiring organization — to be giving and receiving grace every day with this remarkable group of people. And I am very grateful for you and your ongoing support of our healing mission.

I think often of Mrs. Eddy's phrase, "where heart meets heart reciprocally blest" (*Miscellaneous Writings*, p. 207), knowing that blessings must always be reciprocal when our actions are motivated by a heartfelt desire to express the love of God to everyone we meet. May you continue to experience the blessings that are sure to come from your continued support of this very special place, Fern Lodge.

# Annual Meeting 2025

This fall brought a new experience for all of us at Fern Lodge: A first-ever joint Annual Meeting with Twelveacres, our neighbor organization in the Bay Area serving individuals with special needs who wish to rely on Christian Science for healing and progress.

The inspiration for this event was many years in the making. For some time, Fern Lodge and Twelveacres have been part of an increasing effort by Christian Science care facilities in the region to work more closely together.

For example:

- We are both members of the West Coast Christian Science Care Cooperative, through which the leaders of organizations from Arizona to Alaska meet regularly to collaborate, share ideas, and support each other in our service to the community.
- We have shared administrative resources, like HR and legal services, operational tools, and suppliers — connecting each other to trusted sources as needs arise.
- We share staff members. During this past year, for example, three Christian Science nurses working at Fern Lodge have also worked part-time at Twelveacres. All three have expressed appreciation for the ability to have a more diverse experience, and for the opportunity to learn and grow in new ways.
- We've shared training. Some Twelveacres staff have found it helpful to take an introductory Christian Science nursing class through Fern Lodge. Twelveacres has reciprocated by conducting training for Christian Science nurses (and some other staff members) from Fern Lodge on serving individuals with special needs.
- And when, from time to time, Twelveacres residents find themselves in need of skilled nursing care, it has been natural for Fern Lodge to provide assistance.

Given this history of cooperation, it seemed natural for us to collaborate on our Annual


Meeting, as well.
